<i>Role</i>	Exercise initiative and independence when performing individual and group tasks.
<i>Learning to Learn</i>	Take responsibility for personal learning, time management, study skills, report writing, teamworking, health and safety, and quality of work in a structured context in a managed environment.
<i>Insight</i>	Reflect on personal performance in an equine environment to inform self understanding and future professional development.

Award standards are thresholds, they describe standards of knowledge, skill or competence to be acquired, and where appropriate, demonstrated, by a learner before an award may be made.

## 7. FET Credit

Learner effort is based on the time taken by typical learners at the level of the award to achieve the learning outcomes for the award. It includes all learning time involved including: guided learning hours, self-directed learning and assessment.
