Purpose	<p>This award recognises basic knowledge, skill and competence regarding personal decision making. It provides recognition for appropriate use of language and concept within a variety of familiar and well supported contexts.</p> <p>It provides credit towards the Level 2 Certificate in General Learning.</p>
Learning outcomes	<p>The learner will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(M1) Identify major instrument groups, e.g. <i>percussion, wind, string</i>(M2) Respond to short pieces of music played in different styles, e.g. <i>clapping, tapping, marching, swaying to jazz, folk, rock, classical, rap</i>(M3) Use instruments to create music(M4) Differentiate between rhythmic and melodic patterns, e.g. <i>getting faster or slower</i>(M5) Use appropriate language to describe the pace and pitch of pieces of music(M6) Identify music associated with familiar social, cultural and historical contexts, e.g. <i>traditional, folk, anthems, carols, ballads, pop songs</i>
Transfer	<p>Learners who successfully complete this component are eligible to transfer to programmes leading to other awards at Level 2 as appropriate to the requirements for the specific named award.</p>

Evidence

This may include:

- Tapes of participation in performances
- Groups or collections of objects and instruments
- Annotated song/play lists
- Tutor verification

Grading

The achievement of awards at Level 1-3 are graded as follows:

Successful indicates that the learner has achieved **all** the learning outcomes, within a narrow range of predictable and structured contexts.

Referred indicates more learning is required to enable satisfactory achievement of one or more learning outcomes.
