1. MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 15 July 2015

The minutes of the PAEC Meeting held on 15 July 2015 were CONFIRMED.

2. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

2.1 Update on Programme Validations

The Committee NOTED the documentation tabled at the meeting containing an update on programmes whose validation had been finalised since the last meeting i.e. Protection for Enrolled Learners (PEL) has been accepted.

2.2 Boom Sprayer Pesticide Application Programmes

At the meeting on 10 June 2015, the Committee deferred the decision to validate an application from a provider offering Boom Sprayer Pesticide Application programmes until a verification visit to the provider had been undertaken by the Executive. It was NOTED that the verification visit was undertaken on 24 August 2015 to the satisfaction of the Executive. The Committee APPROVED the programme (PG21365) subject to the provider being in good standing with QQI.

Other craft programmes may be evaluated solely against the professional award-type descriptors. These five programmes are collaborative programmes and the collaborators are:

- Institutes of Technology/Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT)
- SOLAS approved employers

The Committee APPROVED the validation of the programmes subject to the various conditions identified within the report being fulfilled within the specified time period of 12 or 24 months, as the case may be. The Committee NOTED that the validation report will be published on the QQI website.
