APPENDIX 1

QQI Approved Research Programmes in Higher Education Institutions - For Information

Context

This paper provides information on the number of research applications currently with QQI under the 'research approval' option on the Research Policy and Criteria. The QQI policy approach on the extension of delegated authority to level 9 research awards is intended to have an impact on the 'approval' option While the work required to implement this policy approach is on-going, the current process for research approval continues i.e. applications are being received by QQI from HEIs requesting approval to register students on Masters and PhD programmes. Appendix A overleaf summarises the current numbers of research programmes per HEI, approved by QQI and yet to be awarded.

These providers have other research programmes ongoing which have either accredited status or are under delegated authority. The full list of research disciplines under each status in each HEI is shown in Appendix B.

This information is now stored on a database and is being reconciled with the HEI's to remove any students who may have dropped out without completing.

Points to Note

- 1. When the decision to delegate authority for Level 9 programmes is implemented, the status of programmes such as those represented on Appendix A needs to be factored in i.e. those programmes previously approved by HETAC and QQI need to be formally handed over to the HEI's as well as authority to validate and award future programmes
- 2. The future research validation arrangements, if any, of the two non-IoT providers who have current approval status need to be considered.
- 3. For those providers, listed below, which only have Approved status for research programmes, Appendix A depicts their full research provision.
